- (a) All painting work had been completed in the year. Budget reduced to normal anticipated spend.
- (b) Reduced to a more realistic figure based on current expenditure.
- (c) Re-surfacing of teen and swing area undertaken and invoiced in the year.
- (d) Committee agreed to build up a reserve specifically for replacing surface in the toddler area and for play equipment.
- (e) The figure is 50% of the income received in the year 2017/18.

Proposed by Cllr. Randles, seconded by Cllr. Ellams and RESOLVED - that the Parks, Cemetery & Allotments Committee recommend budget for 2019/20 totalling £20,366 for the inspection and approval of the Finance Committee – PCA38/18

Other committee expenditure in the year includes: -

- f) Circumference pathway around Parish Field expenditure to date = £33,878. Awaiting invoice for new gate £1,450 excl VAT
- 7. Parks, Cemetery & Allotments Committee expenditure 5-Year Plan. Cllr. O'Neill had prepared the estimates for the committee's approval.
 - (i) Re-surfacing the soft safety surface in the Children's Play Area. Teen and swing area complete. Committee would continue placing £8,000 in reserve as the toddler area would require replacement in the new few years. The Committee also discussed replacing the large play equipment installed in 2008/09. It was guaranteed for 20 years but was very expensive to purchase and install. It was agreed to continue placing £8,000 year on year for the foreseeable future to build up funds to that effect.
 - (ii) Circumference pathway around the Parish Field complete duly noted.
 - (iii) Painting of park railings complete duly noted.
 - (iv) Flooding slot drain The Eccies RSK had agreed to undertake this work duly noted.
 - (v) Domed litter bins for children's park complete duly noted.
 - 7.1 Balance of Section 106 money for children's play / open space / public art.
 - (i) The committee had some initial thoughts about renewing the youth shelter.
 - (ii) Following the pathway project, members of the public had asked for overhead lighting all the way along the path that linked Lower Robin Hood Lane and Parkfield Drive. Cllr. Gardner suggested placing Passive Infra-red lighting on the Guide Hut. Another suggestion was solar-powered overhead lighting. The Clerk asked that members be mindful that the general reserves were low and any funding for capital schemes would have to come from s.106 money subject to CWaC approval. Proposed by Cllr. Holder, seconded by Cllr. Ellams and RESOLVED that the Parish Council be RECOMMENDED to investigate type and funding for lighting the pathway, at the bottom of the parish field, between Parkfield Drive and Lower Robin Hood Lane PCA39/18.
